
# **New HTE School Opens**

The new Howard T. Ennis School on Patriots Way north of Millsboro officially opened on January 3.

Construction of the 94,000-squarefoot facility began in the fall of 2020 and was substantially completed in time for students and staff to move in after Christmas Break. Delays on the construction of the therapy pool have pushed its expected completion date back to late-February.

Ennis families got their first look at the new school at a special open house event during parent conferences on January 12.

The district will host a dedication ceremony this spring once the therapy pool and other punch list items have been completed.

January 3 was a historic day in the Indian River School District, as the new Howard T. Ennis School north of Millsboro officially opened to students and staff. It was wonderful to be there that morning and watch the Ennis family take ownership of the modern facility it so richly deserves. After more than 50 years at its previous location in Georgetown, Howard T. Ennis can now provide services to students with disabilities in a state-of-the-art learning environment. Although construction delays prevented the therapy pool from being ready

on opening day, we anticipate it's completion in late-February. We look forward to hosting a formal dedication ceremony this spring once the pool and a few remaining construction projects have been completed. I want to thank Howard T. Ennis staff members for their hard work and dedication in making sure the new school was ready for students following Christmas Break. Moving in the middle of a school year is never easy, but teachers and staff were up to the challenge and I commend them for their passion and dedication. I hope the entire Ennis community enjoys its new school!

Across the street, site work is continuing at the new Sussex Central High School property. Work on the building pad is tentatively scheduled to begin in March, with structural steel to follow in June. The new 309,000-square-foot school is slated to open in the fall of 2025. Although budget issues continue to be a concern due to the fluctuating market for construction materials, we remain committed to providing the first-class facility that was promised to our taxpayers when they generously approved the major capital improvement referendum in February 2020. We will work tirelessly to deliver a school in which our community can be proud.

As we move past the halfway point of the school year, I want to take this opportunity to thank our staff members for their efforts in keeping our schools running smoothly. IRSD has some of the most gifted professionals in the State of Delaware, whether they be teachers, counselors, secretaries, custodians or support staff. I feel fortunate to work with these individuals every day and witness first hand their commitment to our schools. Their dedication is integral to providing our nearly 10,800 students with the best-possible educational services.

#### Crandell Wins Second Straight Gatorade Award

Brynn Crandell of Indian River High School was recently named Gatorade Delaware Cross Country Player of the Year for the second consecutive year.



# **GES Students Participate** in Delaware GOTR 5K Run

On December 4, students from Georgetown Elementary and several other district schools participated in the statewide Girls on the Run 5K at Delaware Technical and Community College in Dover.

Girls on the Run (GOTR) is a social/emotional program that focuses on the connection between physical and emotional health to empower girls and strengthen their confidence. Participants work hard each week to navigate topics that require vulnerability and self-reflection and the feelings that may be associated with those topics.

A recent independent study found that 97 percent of GOTR participants learned critical life skills associated with conflict resolution and decision-making, 85 percent improved in confidence and 40 percent increased their physical activity level.

GOTR coaches and volunteers at Georgetown Elementary would like to acknowledge the growth, courage and hard work displayed by all student participants.


## **Georgetown Middle Expands CTE Offerings**

Georgetown Middle School's exploratory teachers have worked this year to create additional pathways related to Career and Technical Education (CTE).

Ms. Lowe, Mr. Schwendtner and Mr. Timmons are working to provide real-world, hands-on experiences for students while supporting core teachers with curriculum overlap. Students can regularly be seen collaborating in groups, problem solving and designing solutions to classroom problems while learning the skills to solve tomorrow's industry and career problems.

Mr. Schwendtner and Mr. Timmons have implemented Project Lead The Way for Grades 6-8. Mr. Schwendtner has three courses including Flight and Space (6th), Medical Detectives (7th) and Science of Technology (8th). In






Flight and Space, students learn basic physics related to flight and rockets. Seventh graders learn about vital signs and disease diagnosis, and end with a brain dissection. Eighth grade uses applied chemistry to make ice cream and clean up an oil spill. Students also learn about nanotechnology used in clothing and sunscreen.

Mr. Timmons is currently working with all grade levels on App Creators to teach the basics of coding using the coding program MIT App Inventor, provided by an industry-leading computer science institution. This class allows students to explore the basics of coding and create custom apps for tablets, cell phones and computers using concepts from the C++, Java and Python coding languages. Next school year, the program will be expanded to include the Automation and Robotics, and Design and Modeling courses to expose students to more career options

within the technology and computer science domains.

Ms. Lowe has recently joined the exploratory team as the school's first Exploring Agricultural teacher. Students learn how agriculture is woven into every aspect of our lives and how human influences on our natural resources are necessary for a thriving agricultural industry. Students are looking forward to her school garden, greenhouse and outdoor classroom for the upcoming school year.
